

## WELCOME

For 70 years, Island Beach State Park (IBSP) has welcomed visitors from all over the world. If this is your first time here, welcome to the most beautiful place in New Jersey, and if you've been here before, welcome back! Hopefully, you have had the chance or plan to explore more of the park than just the beach. About 3.5 miles south of the swimming beaches, get immersed in the park's history and/or ecology at former US Life Saving Service/US Coast Guard Station #112, now home to IBSP's Nature and Interpretive Centers. Here, you can explore the deep-rooted history of IBSP, observe the unique native barrier island flora and fauna, and discover new outdoor classroom education stations. While you're here, enjoy a hike along Johnny Allen's Cove trail, which extends from the Atlantic Ocean to the Barnegat Bay, and meanders through 9 exclusive barrier island plant communities.

During your time at IBSP, you may notice ongoing road construction activities. While a minor inconvenience, the work is a necessary step up our efforts to protect and enhance Island Beach State Park. Upon completion, the park will have a brand new sanitary sewer system, eliminating the 8 outdated septic systems that have been in place since the 1950's. All work should be completed by Fall 2023. Thank you for your continued patience and understanding.

This year, staff and volunteers have been hard at work making the park a safe and enjoyable place to visit. Please take time to thank them and ask questions when you see them. Most of all, enjoy your stay at IBSP!

- Horseback riding permitted October to April on southern 6 miles of Ocean Beach

- Mobile sport fishing Vehicle permits are sold out for 2023.
- Additional permits will be available October 1, 2023.
- Air stations located at Park Office and Parking lot A6/A7

## Two Cameras Live Stream Island Beach State Park to the World

It is used daily by surfers, fisherman, and beach goers. The Pete McLain Osprey Camera provides a live stream of the osprey nest located near the Interpretive Center. 




## **Trails:**

- Spizzle Creek Bird Blind Trail (1-2 hours; 1.5 miles)
  - Little Bay Trail (2-3 hours; 3 miles)
- Marsh Elder Trail (2-3 hours; 2.5 miles)
- Buster Island Trail (2-3 hours; 3 miles)

Most visitors to Island Beach State Park are unaware that the 1,900 acre Sedge Islands Marine Conservation Zone (SIMCZ) is located along the southwestern end of the park. This pristine natural area has a variety of shallow, narrow channels carving the saltmarsh into a series of islands that make the area perfect for exploring by kayak. Osprey, Peregrine Falcons and a variety of wading birds make this area an incredible place to view wildlife. While activities such as fishing, crabbing and clamming are permitted, personal watercraft are prohibited in the area.

The SIMCZ is best accessed from launch areas at parking lots A15 and A21. The kayak launch at A21 is an unloading/loading zone only. No vehicles are permitted to park in this area. Paddlers should be aware that strong winds, swift tidal currents and exposed sand bars at low tide can make paddling in some parts of the SIMCZ challenging. Maps showing kayak trails are available at the park office, nature center or by logging on to savebarnegatbay.org. Don't forget to apply sunscreen before you launch and drink plenty of water while you are paddling.





## Happy Birthday Island Beach State Park



#### **LENAPE INDIANS**

The earliest known visitors to Island Beach, built seasonal settlements to hunt waterfowl and shore birds, fish, crab, clam, collect and produce wampum, gather eggs and trap turtles and muskrats. This year, we honor all members of Lenape tribes!



## **EUROPEAN EXPLORERS**

European explorers: Sailing west to explore the "New World," the first recorded description of IBSP was written in 1609. The place was "a good land to fall in with and a pleasant land to see." This year, we celebrate all explorers!



## US LIFE SAVING SERVICE & US COAST GUARD

In 1846, the United States Life Saving Service was established. In 1915, the Life Saving Service merged with the Revenue Cutter Service to form the present-day Coast Guard. Three Coast Guard stati'ons are still in existence at Island Beach. This year, we celebrate all USLSS & USCG service men and women!



## EARLY TOURISM & FISHING SHACKS:

Early accommodations included primitive fishing shacks, of which there were nearly 100 on Island Beach. Two hotels were built: the Reed and Haring Hotels. This year, we celebrate all "Shackers" and vacationers!

On July 1, 2023 Island Beach State Park (IBSP) turns 70 years old! The park would like to celebrate this milestone by looking back through the years and honoring the countless people that have traveled through, lived in, vacationed at and/or have been connected to the Island.



## **BARNEGAT BAYMEN**

By the 1850's the culture of "Baymen" began to emerge. Early settlers supplemented their diet and income with fish, clams and waterfowl. It wasn't long before these baymen were able to support themselves entirely from the waters of the Barnegat Bay. This year, we celebrate all who love the Barnegat Bay!



## **PHIPPS ESTATE**

In 1926, Henry Phipps purchased Island Beach to create an exclusive summer resort. The 1929 stock market crash and the Depression brought an end to his dream. He died in 1930 and Island Beach was left under the care of Francis Freeman. In 1933, Freeman formed the Borough of Island Beach. This year, we celebrate the Phipps Estate and everyone involved!



#### **MILITARY**

During World War II, a Coast Guard detail was assigned to patrol the beach. In 1945, scientists from Johns Hopkins University tested the world's first supersonic anti-aircraft missile at Island Beach. "Operation Bumblebee" was a success, traveling over 9 miles at 1.5 times the speed of sound, and was the prototype for modern rocket weapons. This year, we celebrate all military personnel!



#### **STATE PARK**

In 1953, the State of New Jersey purchased Island Beach for 2.7 million dollars. When Governor Driscoll accepted the deed from the Phipps' heirs, he stated "Island Beach is unique. It is a jewel. There is nothing like it anywhere else on earth." This year, we celebrate you and everyone else that enjoys IBSP!








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
